Bloodworks Northwest says Western Washington & Oregon Blood and Platelet supply drops 40%

Local donors needed to recover blood supply during Childhood Cancer Awareness Month

Nearly 1/3 of all blood donations support children and adults with cancer

Concern grows there will not be enough blood for our community's sickest patients

(September 17, 2021) SEATTLE – Christine O'Connell will never forget St. Patrick's Day 2017, the day she received the shocking news that her three-year-old daughter Jane had stage IV kidney cancer that had already spread to both lungs, lymph nodes, and spine. Jane is now four years cancer-free thanks to the help of local blood donors who supported Jane and pediatric patients like her by giving blood. Today, concern from Bloodworks Northwest grows that there will not be enough blood for our community's sickest patients.

WHAT:

In the past week, the Pacific Northwest's blood supply has lost 40% of its inventory as 1,500 donation appointments are canceled – the equivalent of 30% of needed weekly appointments – making it difficult to fill last minute and putting the local blood and platelet inventory dangerously low during a time of high patient need.

Media coverage is vital to inform donors of need and Bloodworks donation locations.

WHY:

Due to increase in hospital demand and likely covid quarantine related appointment cancelations:

- 10-20% of platelet appointments are being canceled with less than a 24-hour notice putting patients with cancer or victims of trauma at risk
- 700 open platelet appointments in September
- The short five-day shelf life of platelets means the need for donations is continuous
- Over 2,000 open whole blood donation appointments (the traditional way to give blood) in the next two weeks

• While hospitals have delayed non-emergency surgeries due to limited beds, demand for blood is higher than at pre-pandemic levels.

Because of the above:

- Not enough platelets available to support local hospital needs
- Type O inventory is at emergency low levels 900 units below a safe and reliable three-to-four-day supply that must be ready for transfusion when illness or accidents strike
- Type A negative and B negative hovering at critical or low levels
- In pre-COVID times, our supply would be able to recover from a crisis within a week from a strong response from our community. With reduced capacity due to social distancing, it will take weeks for our supply to recover.

WHEN: Immediately in September and October

September is Childhood Cancer Awareness Month and Blood Cancer Awareness Month

WHERE: Bloodworks Northwest <u>Donor Centers</u> or <u>Pop-Up Community Blood Drives</u>.

HOW: Appointments can be made at bloodworksnw.org or by calling 800-398-7888. Masks and

appointments required. Same day appointments available. There is no deferral from

donating if you receive the COVID vaccine. See COVID-19 safety measures.

WHO: Anyone who is eligible to donate should book an appointment in the immediate days

and weeks ahead. It is not necessary to know your blood type to donate.

As we head into new back-to-school routines and a rise in COVID-19 cases, it is imperative that donors know the need, as well as where they can donate in the days and weeks ahead. Blood donation remains a <u>safe and essential action</u> with Bloodworks operating under strict COVID-19 cleaning and safety protocols such as masks and appointments to meet community needs and keep everyone safe.
